General information

FELLOWSHIP TRAINING PROGRAM

Objectives:

The Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology Fellowship at the Hadassah University medical center is a one and a half -year program. Its goal is to teach fellows the basic science of embryology, physiology and reproductive endocrinology. Fellows during training should become familiar with diagnosis and management of common problems in pediatric and adolescent gynecology, such as vulvovaginal problems in young children, puberty disorders, menstrual irregularity, performing minor surgical procedures and ecc., as well as uncommon and more complex conditions, such as congenital reproductive anomalies, rare genetic diseases (due to the practice of Inbreeding in certain sectors), disorders of sex development, pediatric and adolescent gynecologic malignancies, gynecologic disorders in children with medical complications and complex reproductive endocrinopathies.

The fellow will take part in academic duties of the center, such as teaching students and residents and performing clinical or basic research.

The Training program aims to prepare the fellow for the IFEPAG exam part I + II and make him or her able to function professionally as a medical expert in the field of pediatric and adolescent gynecology

Fellowship program:

Clinical:

The fellow will participate in all PAG inpatient and outpatient clinics: DSD clinic, Ped Endocrinology unit, Ped hematology clinic, Ped psychiatry ward activities and ecc

PAG-surgery as gynecological, urological and pediatric surgeon activities as well as collaborative complex operation done on girls with complex congenital malformations,

Special focus will be emphasized on pediatric Emergency Room and sexual abuse center.

Rotations through several other pediatric subspecialties would be available dependent on fellow interest. Including: Adolescent Medicine, Pediatric Genetics, pediatric anesthesia, fertility preservation program and more.

Teaching:

Fellows will participate in PAG team staff meetings, educational conferences and teach in clinics as well as in the operating room to both residents and medical students.

Research:

Fellows will usually enroll in 6 months basic science or clinical research program . Hadassah University Medical Center is very well organized for research programs, ranging from clinical to highly sophisticated basic sciences

Structure

1 year of clinical and surgical activities

6 months of academic activities

Requirement for training

- Speaking English (or Hebrew) language
- Medical doctor (MD) graduate
- Complete residency in Ob&Gyn or Pediatrics

Assessment

During training the fellow will be evaluated through examinations, once in six months

At the end of the training, the fellow will be able to apply for the International Fellowship examination of Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology, Part I and II
